Mr Razzell offers the following advice to businesses looking to enter the China market in 2018: "[The] Chinese are very smart consumers, and have high expectations on service and quality-so make sure you are coming to China for the right reasons. Make sure your reasons are



going to have a positive social, environmental and economic outcome to China and its people. Plan, budget and research well as there are no quick wins, as China is an increasingly complex and sophisticated market; however, there are significant long term wins to be had over time."
